TRANSPORTATION

Camp Bus – The Camp provides round-trip bus transportation from 1298 Main Street, for each residential session. We offer a bus from Niagara Falls for Session 4. There is no transportation provided for the day camp children.

Private Car – Residential Campers - Drop off times are Sunday between 2:30 and 3:00 pm. Pickup the following Saturday between 9:30 and 10:00 am.

Day Campers - Drop off times are between 8:15 and 8:30 am Monday through Friday. Pickup times are between 4:30 and 4:45 pm Monday through Friday.

Please note: Proper documentation of anyone picking your child up will be required. They must be on our list, and show picture ID.

ACTIVITIES

Each day campers attend craft activities with their cabin in a set schedule with each session lasting for 1 hour. This allows all campers to experience a variety of activities and allows the staff to plan for the various age groups. Craft activities include Arts and Crafts, Swimming, Music, Bible, Nature, and Athletics.

Free craft is an opportunity for campers to choose the activity they would like to participate in. These activities include all craft areas as well as "special crafts" that are added only for free craft. Other areas of camp are opened up to give counselors the chance to offer something extra to the program. Some of these extras may involve additional instruction in

sports (soccer, touch football, etc.), handicrafts (macramé, boondoggle, etc.), beach/nature hikes are among the activities that exist to choose from.

Evenings are devoted to special camp programs, which may involve the entire camp or individual cabins. The last night of the session is reserved for our special awards campfire at which cabins and individual campers are recognized for their efforts in the camp competitions or for individual accomplishment.
